Prior to this, James completed a PhD in the conservation and behavioural ecology of the endangered Gouldian finch in the Kimberley region of northern Australia.



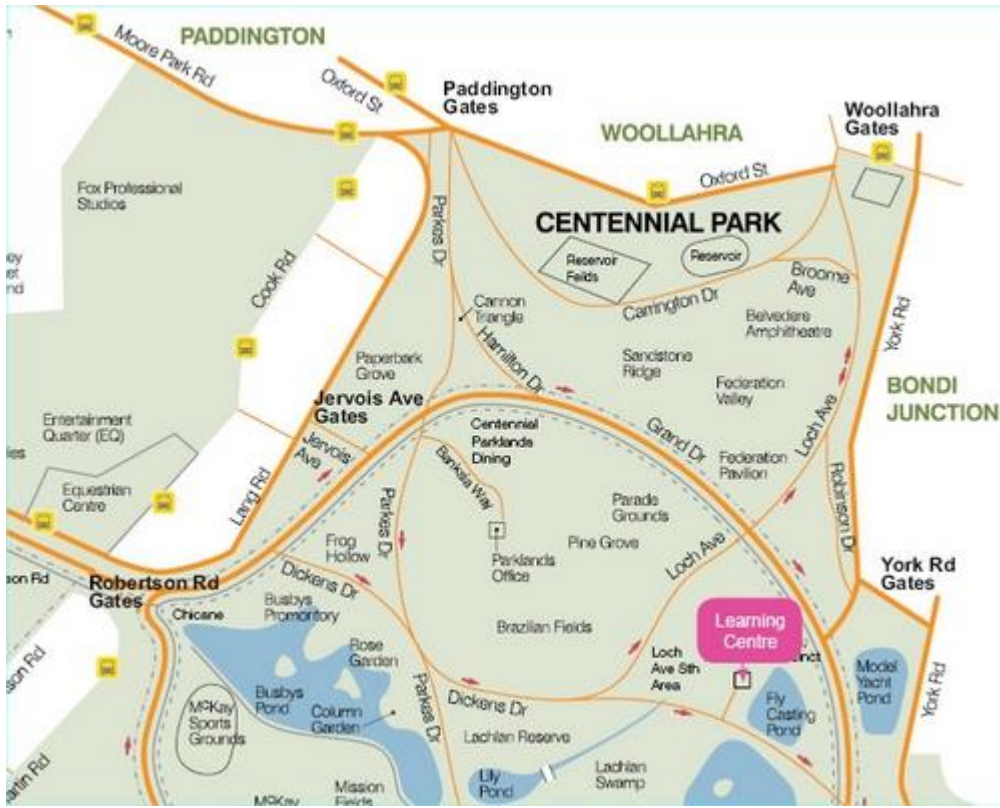
