Research Grants Capacity-Building Grants

Australia is home to around 8 per cent of the world's plant and animal species — with an estimated 566,400 species occurring here. Every day we are making new and exciting discoveries about Australia's biodiversity, yet only about 25 per cent of Australia's species have been formally described.

The Australian Biological Resources Study (ABRS) is contributing to furthering our knowledge of the taxonomy of Australia's flora and fauna. Over the last 12 months, research projects funded by the ABRS have resulted in the description of 79 new genera and 741 new species — however, there is still much more to be discovered.

Research Grants

 The ABRS offers three year Research and Postdoctoral Fellowship Grants where the researcher's primary aim is to undertake taxonomic research on the Australian biota or to develop products that aid in the dissemination of taxonomic information on the Australian biota.

Capacity-Building Grants

- The ABRS offers Capacity-Building Grants for taxonomic and systematics research on Australian flora and fauna in the form of Honours, Masters and PhD awards.
- The ABRS is also offering applicants beginning a PhD on an Australian Postgraduate Award (APA) in 2016 the opportunity to top up their APA by \$10,000 per year.
