Reality 1:

- 2021: likely to run in similar way to S2 2020
- 2022 onwards: unlikely that students will switch back to fully face-toface
- Increased importance on student engagement & retention

Teaching sustainability and the new normal

Reality 2:

- Lack of staff
- Recruitment unlikely
- So....
 - Modify curriculum
 - Ensure support of essential units
 - Team teaching (survey coming out soon...)

Program changes

- BIOL3620 (Biological Sciences capstone). Discontinued & replaced with a faculty-level capstone
- BIOL3910 (Advanced Science 3). Discontinued & replaced with a new version of the unit (BIOL3911) that is not PACE designated. AdvSci students can do BIOL3640.
- BIOL3330 (Symbiosis). Discontinued.
- BMOL3201 (Advanced Biochemistry and Cell Biology) added to Biochemistry and Microbiology concn of Human Biology specialisation
- Changes to Infectious Disease and Biosecurity major of the BMedSci
- Eliminate STAT3195 Biostatistics and Epidemiology (no longer offered)
- Add HLTH3302 Principles in Health and Disease 2 to 3000-level option set
- Add HLTH3303 Principles in Health and Disease 3 to 3000-level option set
- Move BIOL2610 Biological Data Analysis from required 2000-level unit list to 10cp option set
- Add HLTH2301 to list of required units
